Our universities stand ready to support the next phase of Australia's economic and social development post-COVID – through higher education that supports the potential of all students and trains the workforce of the future, innovative research that delivers impact for our communities, and strategic partnerships with key countries in our region.

The IRU welcomes Labor's commitment to additional university places and the focus on creating opportunity for disadvantaged students. Already 50% of our students are the first in their family to attend university. The Accord process also provides an important opportunity to review regulatory duplication in existing policy settings, to free up as much room as possible for innovation with new models of education.

The IRU also looks forward to working closely with the new government to realise the opportunities of stronger partnerships through education and research with key countries in our region, including Pacific Island Nations, India and Japan.
